

APS Developing a Revised Reopen Strategy for January 2021

APS is developing a phased-in approach for reopening district schools as we prepare for January 2021. This approach maintains the three instructional delivery models that include the following options: 1) Site Based Virtual Learning, 2) Face to Face Options and 3) Atlanta Virtual Academy.



Designed for families who don't feel comfortable sending their children back to school but ultimately plan to rejoin their enrolled school in the future.

Based on the number of parents who choose this option, the local school will work to provide a virtual option for students.



Designed for families who feel comfortable with returning their students to a face-to-face, inschool environment.

It provides the opportunity for students to return to campus and interact directly – but safely – with their teachers and classmates.



Designed for families who wish to remain in the virtual environment regardless of shifts in delivery models at the local school.

In preparation for the eventual reopening plan, the phased-in approach includes teacher preparation days and phasing in elementary students first followed by secondary students over the first several weeks in January 2021.

In support of reopening APS Schools in January 2021, the district is launching the following activities in preparation for our Return + Learn Plan:

- Expanded academic, wellness and engagement interventions across all schools to address the needlest students
- In-Person learning opportunities for Students with Disabilities enrolled in low-incidence programs
- Launching an Intent to Return Form for all students to select or change previous declaration for January 2021.
- Implementing asynchronous or independent learning on Wednesdays in the month of December.
- Monitoring APS Athletics and identifying potential opportunities for APS Arts to perform/practice in-person in small groups

- As APS prepares for a reopening, deep appreciation and acknowledgement continues to be extended to principals, teachers, support staff and parents.
- Any interventions requiring face to face needs will be offered in alignment with APS' health and safety protocols, developed in close collaboration with public health officials and as recommended by the CDC.
- Interventions DO NOT replace core instruction and will be scheduled around the instructional model. CARE teams will help to assess student referrals, assign appointments and appropriate interventions.
- Schools will have ability to determine what expanded interventions are offered, how interventions are staffed and delivered, and when (before school, during school, after school) interventions are offered.



INTERVENTION Criteria for selecting students for expanded intervention services Failing 2 or more courses ACADEMICS Credit deficient or incompletes from previous school year's transcripts Tier 2 or 3 Academic Plans Students with Disabilities attending Low Incidence Programs (Note: ALL SWD are eligible for participation in intervention programs as recommended by the CARE Team. However, SWD in Low Incidence classes may be considered for face-toface instruction via this model). Students who scored in the Urgent Intervention range on Star Assessments Referred by staff ·Referred by a parent/quardian WELLNESS Referred by a student (Supports from Social Workers, Counselors, Mental Health Students who have demonstrated a need for mental health supports Providers, Psychologists, etc.) Students in need of wraparound supports Students who have been referred for Psychological Evaluations Students currently being served under McKinney-Vento Less than 50% weekly engagement as measured by: ENGAGEMENT Low or no attendance and participation during synchronous virtual instruction Lack of access to technology or connectivity challenges Students with active truancy referrals



Health and Safety Guidelines for Intervention

APS' Health & Safety Guidelines

All schools are expected to adhere to the district's guidelines for health and safety in the implementation of in-person interventions as follows:

- ★ Temperature screening upon arrival for all students and staff
- ★ Intervention groups limited to 8 or less (inclusive of students and staff) within each setting
- ★ Campus capacity limited to 25% at all times
- ★ Consistent and correct use of masks for all students and staff
- ★ Social (physical distancing) at a minimum of 6ft within each setting
- ★ Hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette are followed
- ★ Cleaning and disinfection procedures are maintained throughout the day and between groups
- ★ CARE Rooms must be identified and staffed for all schools
