How is it developed? Miles Elementary will reach out to parents to get their input about our plan, which is revised annually in the spring. The compact pledges that our school will increase in student academic achievement performance in the areas of Math and Literacy.

Miles' goals from School Wide Plan are as follows:

- •By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, the 3rd-5th grade students will increase 18% proficient above above to 25% proficient on the spring 2026 EOG in ELA; SWD students will increase by 3% to 10% by spring 2026; ELL students will increase from 18% to 25% by 2026
- •By the end of the 2025-2026 school year, the 3rd-5th grade students will increase 15% proficient above above to 22% proficient on the spring 2026 EOG in Math; SWD students will increase by 3% to 10% by spring 2026; ELL students will increase from 24% to 31% by 2026
- By May 2026, increase student attendance from 55% to 65% and reduce behavioral incidents and out-of-school suspensions by 10% (from 36% to 26%) by implementing PBIS with fidelity, as measured by monthly attendance reports, behavioral referral data, and suspension records.
