

AP Information/Dual Enrollment Information Night is Wednesday, November 1, 2017, at 6:30 PM in the Theater.

If you have any problems accessing information on the website, PLEASE, PLEASE see Mr. Vincent in order to get hard copies of any forms or information.

- 1) ALL STUDENTS will apply for AP courses online via Grady's website. *Students who need a **PAPER APPLICATION** should see Mr. Vincent (B108) OR get one in the cafeteria (near the microwaves by the college counselors' office).* The link to access the online application is on Grady's website: <http://www.atlanta.k12.ga.us/Domain/3087>. **Choose the "AP Corner" option under Quick Links to access the application and any additional AP information.** The electronic application will be **active from 12:01 AM, Thursday, November 2, 2017 – 12:01 AM, Saturday, December 16, 2017**, and it requires **BOTH** a student's AND a parent's/guardian's electronic signature. ALL APPLICATIONS (online and hardcopy) must be submitted **on or before Friday, December 15, 2017**. If you are submitting a paper application, submit the completed application to Mr. Vincent's office (B108). If he's not in, just slide it under the door OR leave it with a secretary in the Main Office.
- 2) Remember to examine the Minimum Qualifications for Advanced Placement 2018-2019 form. In order to be approved for an AP course, a student should meet **all grade level/prerequisite requirements**. The rule is – IF YOU ARE INTERESTED, APPLY! In addition, the student should meet the minimum requirement in **two** of the following: (1) unweighted subject GPA, (2) teacher recommendation from most current subject-area instructor, (3) PSAT scores or (4) Gifted-Identified. Approval is tentative and does not guarantee placement in the course. **If you meet the prerequisite course requirements but NOT the grade level requirements, there may be a way for you to apply and possibly be approved. Relax. The online application will guide you through this process.**

- 5) Most AP courses require summer work. You must see the current teacher to find out what you need to do AFTER YOU ARE APPROVED for the course. They are as follows: (*The list is subject to change.*)
