

Established Goals

- Increase the number of students scoring at the Proficiency level on the Georgia Milestones in ELA, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies by 3% by May 2019
- By May 2019, 75% of students in each grade level will meet the end of year goal on identified grade level essential skills as measured by the spring administration of the STAR universal screener

Established Goals

- On the Spring 2019 GMAS EOG, 63% of students in third through fifth grades will achieve the grade level Lexile goal
- On the Spring 2019 GMAS EOG, 45% of third grade, 45% of fourth grade, and 45% of fifth grade will achieve a reading status of grade level or above
- On the Spring 2019 GMAS EOG, decrease the percent of students scoring level zero and one on each of the three writing rubrics by 5%
