2023-2024 School Goals

Our students will be well-rounded individuals who possess the necessary academic skills and knowledge and are excited about learning.

Literacy/Reading: Decrease the number of students the GMAS Beginning to Developing continuum and increase the number of student in the Developing to Proficient continuum in ELA by 5% percentage points by spring of 2024.

Math: Decrease the number of students in the GMAS Beginning to Developing continuum and increase the number of students in Developing to Proficient continuum in Math by 5.2% percentage points by spring 2024.
