We are excited to announce our in-person intervention efforts! You may have seen the recent correspondence from Atlanta Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Lisa Herring regarding the District's plan for providing intervention and support for our highest need learners and our students with special needs. If you missed it, [please review her blog post here](#) for that information.

As Dr. Herring shared, Booker T. Washington is finalizing our plan to provide face-to-face intervention for our highest-need students. We launched that effort on November 14th with our seniors. We will continue intervention for seniors only on **November 21, 2020**. Beginning **December 5, 2020** we will offer face to face intervention Saturdays for all grade levels. Interventions will not be limited to Saturdays however, there will be additional opportunities offered through-out the week beginning in December. Through face-to-face interventions, we will address students' needs in the areas of wellness, social-emotional learning, and positive behavior supports.

We will be contacting families directly for those scholars are eligible to receive these services (Dr. Herring's blog provides information on eligibility). In that communication, we will provide specific details about what interventions are being offered at Booker T. Washington High School, how interventions are being staffed and delivered, and when interventions will be offered, whether they are before school, during school, after school or on Saturdays.

This targeted intervention will not replace core instruction and will be scheduled around our students' regular classes. In addition, any face-to-face interventions at Booker T. Washington High School will be in alignment with our health and safety protocols.
