What is Title I?

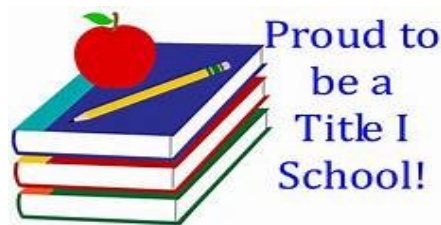
Title I is a federal program designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards in reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for all students.

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Cascade Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Who is it for?

Cascade Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals.

We will:

- ⇒ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.
- ⇒ Provide trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- ⇒ Partner with community resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) by conducting joint meetings for parents and sending school information about parent engagement activities to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.
- ⇒ Share information in English and Spanish on the school blog and in the school newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- ⇒ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school-wide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- ⇒ Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning.
- ⇒ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- ⇒ Use our Partners in Education and GO Team to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parent and family engagement policy.
- ⇒ Offer literacy and computer classes for parents and family members to help further enhance their various educational levels.
- ⇒ Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events, place input cards around the building and post a suggestion form on the school website in order to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
