- i. Kindergarteners take a different version of the MAP assessments specifically focused on foundational reading and numeracy skills.
- ii. Review of 2nd 5th grade comparison with the district
- iii. Analyzed the data to understand if growth targets were met or exceeded projected targeted growth
 - How do we accelerate the proficiency to meet the growth?
 (David)
 - a. Goal setting that are attainable to close the gaps
 - b. Case Loads to partner with the children to better support them in realizing their goals
 - More emphasis is placed on Third Grade Cohort as they were the most impacted by COVID-19 in kindergarten
 - 2. Parent engagement to enable the families to better support their children? (Alexis)
 - a. Curriculum Night to help provide insight and resources
 - b. Parent Liaison with service providers to help support the families and strategies
 - c. Boys & Girls Tutorial Services (one on one and group settings) with certified teachers (learning coaches) to help support the students
 - i. If not at Boys & Girls, there is a 24-hour homework helpline to ensure support is available to the children
 - 3. What would you like to see from parents to help enhance proficiency with our students? (Lauren F)
 - a. Continuing to work with the students with reading to improve their curiosity, creativity and increase vocabulary (context and print)
 - 4. Why do we stop phonics and basic reading skills at the 3rd grade? (Lauren F.)
 - a. Typically, the tailoring of this ends at 2nd grade but was extended to 3rd grade due to COVID-19.
 - Students who need further support have extended opportunities to improve their understanding through small group instruction and the MTSS process if needed.
 - 5. How do you differentiate the learning from those who are proficient as opposed to those who are not? (Lauren F.)
 - a. Learning is differentiated in all classes PK-5 based on students needs.
