It's the largest federal aid program for public schools in the United States. Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improving teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement.

GA Milestones Assessment in ELA and Mathematics

- The second priority for Cascade Elementary during the 2021-2022 school year is to create a positive and healthy school environment where students thrive, teachers enjoy coming to work, and the community trusts.
- Become an authorized International Baccalaureate PYP World School by 2022.
- Attendance Goal- To decrease the percent of students absent 10% or more of enrolled days by 2 percentage points by closely monitoring students' attendance records and providing incentives for students attending school for 20 consecutive days during each 20-day count. Homerooms with perfect attendance will be announced weekly to encourage students to report to school, a 30-day student attendance celebration will be held, and a 30-day attendance board will be displayed. Cascade will involve parents by facilitating parent workshops, sending written communications apprising them of the compulsory attendance law, and contacting parents by phone.
- Intervention Goal- To decrease the percent of students not meeting the standard in core content subjects by 3 percentage points by providing school-wide intervention program, EIP services using the innovative model and after-school Wednesday tutorial.

THE HOME

Families joined faculty and staff to develop ideas about how they can support students' success in Reading and Math.

- Check its learning weekly for posted assignments
