- 4. Caps, hats, head wraps, bandanas, hoods, or other head coverings must not be worn in the school building during the school day. Hijabs are permissible.

5. Appropriate shoes must be worn at all times at school and school sponsored activities. For the safety of students, open-toe shoes/ sandals are not allowed.
