- ★ March: Initial Course requests released and course request changes completed
- ★ Mid-April: Final round of Course Requests are distributed
- ★ April-July: Course placement and scheduling at the school level takes place
- ★ August: Student Schedules released

Course Request vs. Student Schedule

Course Request

- ★ Projected courses a student will take
- ★ Completed prior to all data being available
- ★ May not reflect final courses on the student schedule

Student Schedule

- ★ Final courses with specific rotation and teacher assignments
- ★ Completed once all student data is available

- ★ All course requests and change requests will be done via a google form
- ★ A response will not be provided once the form is complete, but the change will be reflected on the student's course request if student data supports the change
- ★ Please only submit 1 entry per request
- ★ Please create a Parent Portal account to be able to view course requests

World Language vs. Reading Placement

- The International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program (IBMYP) provides an opportunity for students to take a World Language
 - French and Spanish are offered at all grade levels
 - Students earn HIGH SCHOOL credit for their World Language course (6-8th grade)
 - Students remain in the same World Language for their middle school years
- Based on student achievement data, some students will be placed into a Reading course for targeted intervention
- Students receiving ESOL support will have a language acquisition course in place of World Language



Connections Courses

- ★ All students take 2 Connections courses each semester
- ★ Students can opt in to Band, Orchestra, or Chorus
 - o These courses will be scheduled as a year long class on an A/B rotation
- ★ All 7/8th grade students will complete a course request for their preferred connections classes in February 2021
 - ★ Physical Education
 - **★** Health
 - ★ Visual Art
 - ★ Digital Art
 - **★** Dance

Advanced Content (AC) Courses

Language & Literature (L&L), Individuals & Societies (I&S), and Science are offered at 2 levels:

- ★ Advanced Content
- ★ Grade Level



Advanced Content Criterion:

- <u>Internal</u> teacher recommendation from current teacher- please note that no teacher recommendation letters will be accepted from parents/guardians
- 90th percentile on Spring STAR test using the <u>state benchmark</u> cut scores
 - Math STAR will be used for science placement
 - Reading STAR will be used for L&L and I&S placement
- 88 or higher in the course

Math Progression and Placement

6th Grade Math

7th Grade Math

8th Grade Math

Students may be selected by invitation from the district math department to participate in "Level Up" over the summer and move to Math 7B/8 for 7th grade upon completion.

Students may be selected by invitation from the district math department to participate in "Level Up" over the summer and move to Algebra I for High School credit in 8th grade upon completion

Students will take a placement test at the end of their 8th grade year to determine math placement for high school.



Accelerated Math Progression and Placement

Math 6/7A

Math 7B/8

Algebra I

We are still waiting on final decisions form the district for placement criteria in Accelerated Math. We will continue to keep families updated once this criteria has been determined.

Students need to successfully complete Math 6/7A with an 80 or above to remain enrolled in the accelerated track.

Students need to successfully complete 7B/8 to remain in accelerated track. Students will take a placement test at the end of their 8th grade year to determine math placement for high school.
