Discussion Items

- A. **Discussion Item 1**: General Updates from Opening of School Year
 - i. Student Start Update:
 - Enrollment: Projected 508 Students, Current Enrollment = 476 students, different of 32 less students. Due to less enrollment, we will lose our reserve fund and options the reserve fund offered BPA.
 - 2. Leveling: As a result of leveling, we are losing 65K of our reserve budget.
 - ii. School Strategic Plan
 - Principal White presented our BPA Strategic Plan. It is focused on our 4 SMART Goals. The SMART Goals are the drivers of our Strategic Plan.
 - a. Strategic Priorities:
 - i. Structured Literacy to improve Outcomes in Readin/ELA at all levels
 - ii. Increased focus on conceptual understanding to improve outcomes in math at all levels
 - iii. Continue improving our IB PYP program
 - iv. Focus on the Whole Child via SEL, Counseling, and Social Work Services
 - v. Improve teacher efficacy in Reading, Math, and IB
 - vi. Inform and engage with the BPA Community
 - vii. Foster a positive, informed, and engaged school culture

iii. SMART Goals

- 1. The percentage of students in grades 3,4,5 scoring at lesa proficient on the GMAS ELA test will increase from 50% tp 75% by Spring 2025.
- 2. The percentage of students in grades 3,4,5 scoring at lesa proficient on the GMAS math test will increase from 50% tp 75% by Spring 2025.

- 3. Increase the BPA School Climate Star Rating from 4 Stars to 5 stars by 2025.
- 4. BPA Will be re-authorized as an IB PYP World School by 2025 with 100% Standards and Practices met.

iv. GMAS Results

- 1. We took the GMAS state assessment for the first time in 3 years (pre-COVID)
- 2. BPA scored 7th among all APS elementary schools in ELA (Gr. 3-5). Our students performed better in ELA than their expected performance based on the challenge index.
- 3. BPA scored 7th among all APS Elementary schools in Math (Gr. 3-5). We did better than expected in math based on our challenge index.
- 4. POINT OF PRIDE! BPA is tied for 3rd for 3rd grade ELA students scoring at DISTINGUISHED. It's a testament to our early literacy structured literacy program.
- 5. BPA has a gap between the performance of students who are Black in comparison to students who are white. Our achievement gap is half the gap that APS has as a district, meaning BPA students who are Black perform better than other Black students in APS schools. We will have a focus on closing the gap at BPA further.
 - A. Beale Smith inquired about how to close the gap. D.
 White discussed our challenges and the new district equity office as a new resource.

 - i. Discussed the type of person that the Go Team could benefit from having as a Community Member.
 - ii. Suggestion to offer the spot to the other BPA parent that ran for the Go Team in the past election.
