GOALS FOR STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

DISTRICT GOAL(S)

- Literacy Proficiency: The percentage of students in grades 3-8 scoring proficient or above in reading, as measured by GMAS, will increase from 36.9% in 2019 to 47% in 2026.
- Numarcy Proficiency: The percentage of students in grades 3-8 scoring proficient or above in math, as measured by GMAS, will increase from 35% in 2019 to 45.4% in 2026.
